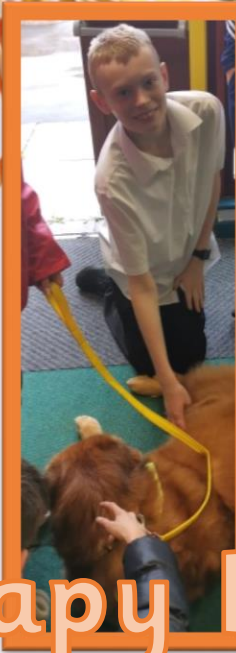


In November, The PTA organised a Fizz Ladies' Fashion Show. Thanks to everyone who attended – we raised £392.

Children in Need Sponsored Splash

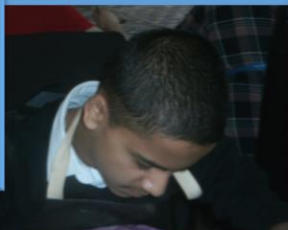
To raise money for Children in Need, AA1 did a Sponsored Splash in our hydrotherapy pool. From this event, we raised over £300.

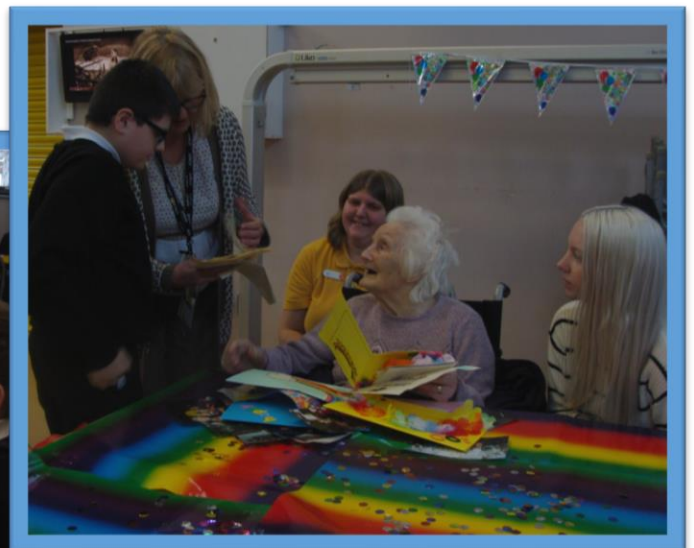




Catherine's 100th Birthday

Christmas Fair

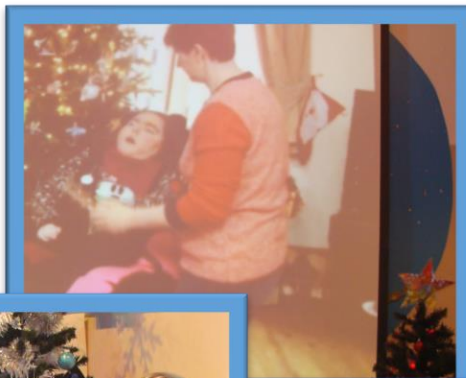
